POLICE NEWS

Touch wood the past month has been a relatively quiet one for us here at the station, which is a welcome relief. We did however receive information in the past two weeks in relation to an indigenous male who was attending numerous addresses from Aloomba to Mirriwinni asking for money. He was using various hard luck stories and appealing for money from good Samaritans many of whom gave him substantial amounts of cash. This person appeared well dressed, confident and was usually driving a white coloured Toyota station wagon. He also dropped the names of several well known identities in the district to gain confidence with his victims. One person even went as far as giving this male a car which he promptly drove off in and failed to return. This male person was subsequently located in Babinda and is now being held in custody in relation to these matters pending his appearance before a court. My thanks to the vigilant members of the community who provided excellent information resulting in the arrest of this male. If you were the victim of this male person please ring the station and inform us so it can be investigated accordingly and justice served. Such behaviour can constitute Fraud and is a criminal offence. Unfortunately there are a all too many people out there who will use any means available to scam unsuspecting and well meaning members of the community. I work on the rule that if it is too good to be true it generally is. It is also important to be vigilant when strangers attend your house requesting money for any purpose be it a salesman or someone requesting help. Don't be afraid to ask questions and if you feel they are attempting to intimidate you or defraud you shut the door and ring the police.

AMBULANCE NEWS

I missed the column last month as I was on annual leave. I did some camping locally, it then started to rain so we headed Townsville way - you usually get a fair bit of sun down there and if it does rain it has its showers then goes away. It sure is different only seeing the locos going through town now and then, not shunting back and forwards all the time like years gone past. So far the crushing period has been safe so lets hope it stays that way.

On a serious but depressing level I should bring peoples attention to their medical options. We can be sent to very ill people with little or no prognosis of improving or living. Unless we have been formally advised or can witness documentation we have do what we can to maintain their life or perform resuscitation if there heart and lungs stop. Sometimes this can be very upsetting to all health workers and in particular the family. Unless there is an advanced health directive or some legal paperwork ambulance, nurses, doctors have to do what is reasonable to keep that person alive. There are some difficult decisions patients and their families have to make - it is always better that there is no confusion and the patients wishes are met. The last thing you need when you are already under stress is more upsetting decisions to be made. It's worth talking about well before you get to this situation.

We have put in for 2 Reef Rescue 4 Waterways projects, one in Babinda Creek and another in the headwaters of Niringa Creek.

We have also put in for \$20K to restore part of Giddins Creek under a Community Action Grant, and \$30K for administrative funding support for RLCG for the next 3 years \$10K per annum).

A final community feedback session on the Babinda Creek Action Plan was conducted, with excellent feedback to finalise the Plan to guide investment for the period 2011 - 2015 into this critical tributary of the Russell River.

I have met with the Cairns River Improvement Trust contractor to discuss progress with our RR3 project on Babinda Creek. The Chairman of the CRIT has also been briefed on the Environmental Sand Extraction Project arising out of the Babinda Creek Action Plan, and we have secured in-kind hydrological technical assistance.

Thanks to Jason Birch the RLCG Project Support person for his invaluable assistance.

"Hi from CRC.

Roadworks to repair damage done by the extended wet season are well underway across the southern part of the city. Council has had a massive repair program to attend to, as well as the normal reseal and other works lists this year, but we have been fortunate to receive from the Australian and Queensland Governments the almost annual disaster relief assistance again to fund this major bill. You may have seen the crews working on the rural roads such as Christiano Access and Clyde Road recently, and it won't be long before work gets underway on the Dinner Creek upgrade. This is a project that I have been pushing for a lot over the years, and money has been set aside in this budget to make the upgrade happen. The causeway will be raised to alleviate constant road closures after rain, and make it possible for those trapped between this crossing and the section of Dinner Creek Road that always gets inundated the opportunity of increased access during the wet. A big job, and I'm pleased to see it finally funded!

We have continued the process for the mill site's future, with another meeting of the Steering Committee last month. Reports on this are available around town, and a brief summary of the proposals put to the Steering Group Committee are also published in this Newsletter.

It is now common knowledge that I will not be contesting the next local government elections. I will have completed 3 terms (12 years) and it has been pleasurable and difficult at the same time! This division seems to throw up complex challenges all the time, a fact commented on continually by our staff in Cairns. and being a part of finding solutions (where possible) to resident's problems has been rewarding. What I will attempt to do in the next few months is bring back some of the highs and lows of the previous 12 years; it may well either inspire or deter potential candidates from standing for election in March 2012!

SETTLERS' MUSEUM ITEM OF THE MONTH

Some of our Senior Citizens may recognise this piece of kitchen equipment: it is made from a four gallon kerosene tin, split in half and carefully enclosed with a painted wooden surround. This was the washing-up sink — one side for hot washing water, the other for rinsing. The mesh metal container with a handle was for scraps of soap so that none was ever wasted.

When we lived in the farm barracks at Fig Tree Creek in 1946 my mother used one of these to wash the dishes for a family of mum'n'dad and three little kids. Water was drawn from the well and heated on a wood stove fired by always-damp rainforest timber.

Kerosene was a multi-use fuel and the sturdy tins were put to many uses, as well as the strong wooden boxes in which the tins were shipped. The Settlers' Museum has several furniture items crafted from the boxes, still bearing the company logo "Vacuum" or "Plume".

The rural world of the 21st century would be unrecognisable to the people of the early to mid 20th century. It is pleasant to hark back to the Good Old Days, but few would want to be a housewife using the primitive, labour intensive equipment with which they coped so well.

The Mulgrave Shire Historical Society has had a request for information on the Town Clock which used to stand in Munro Street in front of the Post Office. If anybody has a photo of the clock, or even a good description, would they please ring me on 40 671 577? Thank You.

Wanda met and married Bob Edmonds in 1957 and had three daughters, Lynette, Debra and Cathryn. Over the years Wanda worked for Trembath's Butchery (where she met young Bob), Mellick's, PMG (Telecom/Telstra) as a telephonist, Dan's Clothing and Haberdashery and Babinda State School. But as much as Wanda may have excelled at any of these jobs she became and still is an excellent Cake Decorator. She has not only made many family wedding, birthday and celebratory cakes, but has made iced and decorated cakes for many, many others as well.

She spent many hours at the school tuckshop and assisting on school sports days.

It is this side of Wanda that has defined her as a truly caring and considerate member of the Babinda community.

We are using this quiet time of year to hone our skills; the last weekend of July was an intensive chainsaw operators' course attended by SES volunteers and instructors from around the region. We learned the theory of chainsaw techniques and maintenance, with a big emphasis on safety, then pulled our saws apart, cleaned and put them back together and sharpened them.

The tourists at Rotary Park at Babinda Creek had their Saturday arvo naps destroyed by the sound of two dozen or so chainsaws at full revs in the old dump area. Brad and the Council Team had prepared the site for us by setting up a range of logs in different configurations to simulate cyclone-downed trees. Thanks Team – Great Job! Light rain and muddy ground added realism to the exercise as we cut, sliced and bored our way through the logs.


Sunday was National Tree Day so we celebrated it by going to East Russell and slaughtering many unwanted regrowth weed trees and cutting up dinkum cyclone debris. This "real" scenario presented us with the challenges of green ants everywhere, a surprised black snake and an inquisitive cassowary. Our Support Team of Dulcie and Nildra excelled themselves with catering for about thirty personnel, and we were all fed to gourmet standards to the extent that it was hard to go back to work after lunch.

A feature of our training was the use of Polesaws - a small chainsaw on a long pole. These are very useful tools but they are heavy in use when fully extended.

Babinda SES now has nine qualified chainsaw operators and a supply of well-maintained saws. The weekend was hard work but very enjoyable and the interaction with fellow-volunteers from the region will be of value in our next big activation.

I hear that the next training item on the calendar is for floodboat operators – we'll be on Top Line for the next cyclone season.

BABINDA & MILL SITE REDEVELOPMENT

Brief Summary of Proposals put forward to Steering Committee:

To View Proposals go to www.babinda.info and click on Mill Closure 2011

To Boost Babinda - from Errol Wiles

- .1. Between Innisfail and Cairns there are no fewer than 20 streams each of which has enormous power potential.
- .2. Make better use of Munro St garden beds. Replace what we have with vegetables for common use. If some of us start others will follow.
- .3. Deed the property of the Nurse's quarters to the Task Force as Babinda Community. The Community would use it for students from all over Australia including groups of desert aborigines to enjoy Wet Tropics Experience. The experience would include all unique features Babinda has to offer etc.
- .4. The now closed mill has a well-equipped laboratory which should be retained/extended for lease to research organisations.
- .5. There is no electroplating works north of Townsville. With government help, a multi-discipline engineering works could be set up on the mill site. A good opportunity for the manufacture of galvanized trailers.
- .6. Our first need is for the government to provide a competent business planner. Ideas may be good but each needs a rational business plan.

Redevelopment of the existing Bicentennial Gardens Park – by Josh Gartrell

Refurbishment and redevelopment of the park, adding amenities such as undercover picnic/electric bbq facilities and composting toilet.

Creating a highly informative historical timeline walk in the park guiding people/tourists from when the Yindinji people dominated the area, through to European settlement and the establishment of the sugar mill. Highlighting also, natural disasters and other events affecting the town through time.

Retaining the sugar industry knowledge/heritage by way of reclamation and restoration of mill machinery such as loco, cane bins, a harvester, tipplers, fly wheels and other machinery involved in the sugar production process. These things could be placed with the Park – adding to the historical timeline walk. Such machinery sitting around unused on farms could also be put to this use.

Proposals for Tourism in Babinda – from Babinda Information Centre

- .1. Iconic Big Umbrella in ANZAC Park will offer shade from sun and shelter from rain with rainfall figures and painted scenes of rainforest trees, animals etc on the underside.
- .2. Construct a walk to Babinda Falls on the left hand branch of the creek from the main pool at the Boulders. Not the falls visible from the road but a series of 3 spectacular falls close to one another. At present the falls are only accessible by walking up the creek bed itself.
- .3. Develop walking/cycling tracks along unused loco lines, along creek banks and other safe off road tracks such as Josephine or Bramston Beach.

Babinda The Must See & Experience NQ Oz Tourist Town - from Gus Lee

Make better use of our unique fauna and flora by way of selling ice blocks (homemade), photos, paintings, regional produces such as tea/coffee should be available.

Pink Noni (Morinda citrifolia 'Allright') – from Gus Lee

Fruit indigenous to Australia known as bush tucker and used as traditional medicine. View to starting Pink Noni industry in Australia.

Ideas for Babinda – from Ivy Zappala

Retain and use the Sugar Mill.

- .1. Have a big Tourist place like 'Stockman's Hall of Fame' showing the history of sugar, canecutters, machinery and implements used etc and tours of the Mill.
- .2. On top of chimney, have large umbrella made of steel.
- .3. In the offices have lots of arts, sugar shop with by products of sugar.




