Since I came here nearly 7 years ago the LAC has purchased books, a training mannikin, a Lifepak defibrillator and an automated Blood Pressure Machine not bad for a little town that has had 2 big cyclones in that time. It is usually the smaller places that help out together to get things done a lot better than the bigger towns and cities. I'll keep it short and sweet, remember to call 000 in an emergency. You will get asked a lot of questions but rest assured whilst you are on the phone another operator is organising an ambulance to get help sent out to you.

POLICE NEWS

You will have noticed a few new Police faces around town. I have taken over as the sergeant officer in charge of Babinda Station, having come from Mt Garnet. Constable Steven GIBB has also joined the Babinda team from Innisfail, and I am sure you already know Constable Darren Green and Shane. This should be a consistent team for the foreseeable future and we look forward to continuing the great work already done in working with the community of Babinda

Traffic enforcement continues in Babinda with Random Breath test being conducted on a regular basis, it is good to see that fewer drivers are being detected over the limit. However speed is a continuing issue, with drivers being caught everyday, either by mobile patrols or by the speed camera, speed limits are there for everyone's safety and breaking them will not only affect you financially but you could lose your licence, so always check you speed. I have notice in the time I have been here that bicycle riders particularly young people are not wearing helmets. This will continue to be a focus of our enforcement, we would rather issues a fine for failing to wear a helmet that have to attend a crash where a bicycle rider has received a head injury through not wearing the appropriate head protection.

Anti social behaviour in town or at our fantastic tourist attractions will not be tolerated. Public place are for everyone to enjoy, not for people to go to get drunk and cause a nuisance. Please continue to report unacceptable behaviour and rest assured we will be more than happy to deal with the culprits.

It is vital that we receive information from the public, the more quality information we get regarding any wrongdoing the better placed we are to deal with it. I encourage you all to report criminal activities so we can send a clear message of what we will accept in our community.

Royalties for Regions ignores FNQ

Sadly, the LNP has again ignored Far North Queensland by excluding it from its Royalties to the Regions scheme.

The Newman Government has earmarked almost \$500 million to be split among 14 local council areas, but not one cent will come to our local area or region.

Not only has the LNP excluded Cairns Regional Council, it has also ignored the Cassowary Coast Regional Council and Tablelands Regional Council.

I am sure FNQ residents will be disappointed that their local LNP MPs have failed to secure even the thinnest slice of this funding for our region.

It's about time that people like Andrew Cripps, Gavin King and the other LNP members in FNQ start standing up for our region.

The Royalties to the Regions program was meant to assist councils facing financial strains caused by the resources boom and the need to invest in services and infrastructure.

To suggest that FNQ councils are not being impacted by the resources boom is absolute nonsense.

Cairns is already a service centre for resources companies such as BHP, Xstrata, Barrick, Newcrest, Kagara and Rio Tinto and already has air services to 18 mining centres.

We are all aware of people in our community working in the resources sector.

To say our region is not linked directly to the resources sector is just plain wrong.

There are also active plans to develop and build on existing links to resource industries in PNG, Cape York, and the North East Minerals Province.

I agree with the Townsville-based Local Government Minister David Crisafulli when he says it is high time resource communities received a fair share of the benefits of the mining boom.

But I would like him to match his words with actions when it comes to the Far North.

Zero dollars out of almost half-a-billion is not our fair share.



MULGRAVE SETTLERS' MUSEUM

This month we feature Murphy the donkey mascot of the United States 503rd Paratroop Regiment. The paratroopers were stationed in the Gordonvale area from December 1942 until August 1943 when they travelled to combat in New Guinea.

Murphy the donkey was dropped from a C-47 cargo plane into a cane paddock, using several heavy parachutes for the job and apparently was none the worse for the experience. There are no reports to tell us just how he was persuaded to leave to aircraft though!!

The men of the 503rd received a big welcome from the local people and regularly attended dances and socials at Deeral and Babinda during their months of intensive training.

The Mulgrave Settlers' Museum in Gordon St Gordonvale has a comprehensive display of memorabilia relating to the 503rd Parachute Regiment – the only U.S. Paratroops to train in Australia.



*The Queen recognises those celebrating their 60th wedding anniversary and 100th birthday and very fifth year thereafter.


How to arrange the message

Margaret Fulton's Pea and Ham Soup

Preparation time 15 minutes - Cooking time 1 hour - Serves 4

Ingredients:

2 onions, sliced 300gr green split peas 2.5lts (10 cups) water

1/2 teasp freshly ground black pepper 1 sprig of fresh thyme

1 bay leaf 1 ham hock 2 carrots, diced 1 cup sliced celery

2 tabsp lemon juice salt to taste cracked black pepper to serve

Method:

- 1. Put the onions, peas, water, pepper, thyme and bay leaf into a large saucepan.
- 2. Add the ham bone, bring slowly to the boil, reduce heat and simmer half-covered for an hour.
- 3. Add the carrots and celery and cook for another hour.
- 4. Remove thyme and bay leaf and discard.
- 5. Take out the ham bone, cut all meat from the bone removing excess fat and any skin, shred and return all but 1/2 cup of meat to the soup.
- 6. Add the salt and lemon juices just before serving. Serve the soup topped with the remaining meat and garnish with cracked black pepper and a few thyme leaves.

<u>Tip:</u>

Soup is a classic winter favourite. To turn this soup into a hearty main meal, add slices of Frankfurt or spicy smoked sausage and heat through. Any leftover soup can be

frozen in an air tight container for up to 3 months.

<u>Mill Memorabilia Project</u>

– a community initiative

FUNDED by Qld Government *Blue Print for the Bush* Building Rural Communities Grant, **SPONSORED** by Babinda Community Bank and **SUPPORTED** by Babinda Information Centre, Babinda Task Force, Maryborough Sugar Factory (MSF), Cairns Regional Council, Department of Employment, Economic Development and Innovation (DEEDI), Mulgrave Historical Society Inc, Bartle Frere Freemasons Babinda Hospital and Babinda Harvest Fest Committee.

Many thanks to the men who turned up and allowed me to record their varied experiences as past Babinda Mill employees and to Tony and Royce Ryan for providing the venue. Oral histories provide valuable sources of information about the community. Thanks also to the community spirit of the Babinda Taskforce for allowing the MMP to have the Mill Directors photographic display in the shop window during Harvest Fest week.

On the 30th May 2012, 6 Mill Memorabilia Project (MMP) representatives met with MSF property manager Dennis Kaye at the Babinda Sugar Mill to identify any mill memorabilia items not of any value to MSF that could be of cultural and historical value to the community. In the process of the walk through, concern was raised by MMP representatives regarding the plan to demolish the reinforced concrete building next to the administration building as it is believed that it may have been originally built as a Wold War II Air Raid shelter and thus a place of historical and cultural heritage value and local significance to people of the Babinda community. I have since raised their concern with Dennis Kaye and our local Councillor Steve Brain. If anyone has any further information regarding the history of this structure please let me know.

On Wednesday 20th June MMP representatives also met with Joanne Macauley, an RPS Archival consultant who along with Darren Rigby is currently preparing an archival report of Babinda Mill to Cairns Regional Council. The report will be a brief historical context for the site and a succinct statement of significance followed by current photographs of the site linked to a site plan. The archival report will be available to the public on completion and will be provide another documented resource of the Babinda communities past as a Sugar Milling town. Joanne has also kindly provided the MMP committee with a copy from the Queensland State Library of the 1937 booklet for visitors to the Babinda Sugar Mill as well as a few copies of historic photographs and survey plans. Thanks Joanne!



Dengue Field Trial Update

By Professor Scott O'Neill, 6 July 2012

Continued monitoring – For a second month in a row our monitoring tells us that the *Wolbachia* read in *Aedes aegypti* mosquitoes in Babinda has fallen - from 71% on 17th May to 64% on 28th June. This is still a promising result and our hope is that the measurement may increase again.

Collecting adults not eggs – Over the wet season we monitored the levels of *Wolbachia* by collecting mosquito eggs in small traps that we set in yards. We have now collected all those traps and instead are gathering our information from adult mosquitoes that are collected in a smaller number of electric 'BG' traps. I would like to thank everyone who is participating in the research; your support is critical to our work.
